1. Aster, Perennial..... 1 spray
2. Aster, Annual 1 cultivar..... 3 blooms
3. Begonia..... 1 stem
4. Chrysanthemum, single..... 1 spray
5. Chrysanthemum, double (see pg. 27 re Spray)..... 1 spray
6. Coleus..... 1 stem
7. Dahlia decorative, **UNLIMITED ENTRIES**..... 1 bloom
8. Dahlia cactus, **UNLIMITED ENTRIES**..... 1 bloom
9. Dahlia any other, **UNLIMITED ENTRIES**..... 1 bloom
10. Gaillardia (Blanket Flower)..... 1 stem
11. Geranium (Pelargonium)..... 1 stem
12. Grasses, Ornamental, one cultivar (NIP)..... 3 stems
13. Heuchera..... 1 leaf
14. Heuchera 3 cultivars..... 3 leaves
15. Japanese Anemone, any colour..... 1 stem
16. Marigold, any size, 1 cultivar..... 3 blooms
17. Phlox, any colour / type..... 1 stem
18. Rose, Hybrid Tea (NIP)..... 1 bloom
19. Rose, Shrub..... 1 bloom
20. Rose, Shrub..... 1 spray
21. Rose, any other type..... 1 bloom
22. Rose, any other type..... 1 spray
23. Rudbeckia..... 3 stems
24. Salvia, 1 cultivar..... 3 stems
25. Sedum, any variety..... 1 stem
26. Sunflower..... 1 bloom
27. Any tropical (NIP).....(see Definition of Terms) 1 bloom/stem
28. Zinnia (NIP)..... 1 stem
29. Any other annual (NIP)..... 1 bloom
30. Any other annual (NIP)..... 1 stem
31. Any other perennial/biennial (NIP)..... 1 bloom

32. Any other perennial/biennial (NIP) 1 stem

Section 'B' Branches of Trees, Shrubs and Vines

ALL BRANCHES MUST BE UNDER 76 cm / 30"

33. Hydrangea, ball type..... 1 branch
 34. Hydrangea, cone type..... 1 branch
 35. Hydrangea, lace type 1 branch
 36. Branch, showing flowers (NIP)..... 1 branch
 37. Branch, showing berries (NIP) 1 branch
 38. Branch, showing seed heads / pods (NIP) 1 branch
 39. Branch, showing foliage only (NIP) 1 branch
 40. Vine, showing flowers (NIP)..... 1 branch
 41. Vine, showing berries / seed heads / pods (NIP) 1 branch

Section 'C' Fruits and Vegetables

42. Apples, 1 cultivar (wipe – don't polish, leave stem on)..... 3 fruits
 43. Beans, 1 cultivar (with calyx & portion of stem attached) 5 pods
 44. Beets, 1 cultivar (tops trimmed to 2.5cm/1" above crown, leave roots on)... 3 roots
 45. Broccoli, 1 cultivar (dense head, no sign of flowering) 1 head
 46. Cabbage, (large coarse outer leaves may be removed) 1 head
 47. Carrots, 1 cultivar topped to 2.5 / 1" 3 roots
 48. Cucumbers, 1 cultivar (short stem should remain)..... 2 fruit
 49. Lettuce, (damaged outer leaves should be removed) 1 plant
 50. Leeks 2 plants
 51. Melon, (should be at proper stage for harvesting) 1 fruit
 52. Onions, 1 cultivar..... 3 bulbs
 Do not peel, only broken outer scales should be removed
 Neatly trim tops and remove roots just below the base
 53. Peppers, 1 cultivar (leave approx. 1.5cm / 1/2 "of stem) 2 fruit
 54. Potatoes, 1 cultivar (brush clean)..... 3 tubers
 55. Squash, summer, 1 cultivar (stem left attached and trimmed)..... 2 fruit
 56. Squash, winter, (wash & leave a short stem)..... 1 fruit
 57. Tomatoes, over 5 cm / 2", 1 cultivar (preferable to leave calyx on) 3 fruit
 58. Tomatoes, 5 cm / 2" and under, 1 cultivar (preferable to leave calyx on)..... 5 fruits
 59. Any other fruit, 1 cultivar (NIP), **UNLIMITED ENTRIES** suitable #
 60. Any other vegetable, 1 cultivar (NIP), **UNLIMITED ENTRIES** suitable #
